Stephen Sondheim (1930-2021) wrote the music and lyrics for Saturday Night (1954), A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM (1962), ANYONE CAN WHISTLE (1964), COMPANY (1970), FOLLIES (1971), A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC (1973), THE FROGS (1974), PACIFIC OVERTURES (1976), SWEENEY TODD (1979), MERRILY WE ROLL ALONG (1981), SUNDAY IN THE PARK WITH GEORGE (1984), INTO THE WOODS (1987), ASSASSINS (1991), PASSION (1994) and ROAD SHOW (2008) as well as lyrics for WEST SIDE STORY (1957), GYPSY (1959) and DO I HEAR A WALTZ? (1965) and additional lyrics for CANDIDE (1973). Anthologies of his work include SIDE BY SIDE BY SONDHEIM (1976), MARRY ME A LITTLE (1981), YOU'RE GONNA LOVE TOMORROW (1983), PUTTING IT TOGETHER (1993/99) and SONDHEIM ON SONDHEIM (2010). He composed the scores of the films "Stavisky" (1974) and "Reds" (1981) and songs for "Dick Tracy" (1990) and the television production "Evening Primrose" (1966). His collected lyrics with attendant essays have been published in two volumes: "Finishing the Hat" (2010) and "Look, I Made A Hat" (2011). In 2010 Broadway's Henry Miller's Theatre was renamed The Stephen Sondheim Theatre in his honour; in 2019, London's Queens Theatre was also renamed the Sondheim.

#### **GEORGE FURTH** Book

George Furth (1932-2008) was born in Chicago and graduated from Northwestern University; he did postgraduate work at Columbia University. He has worked extensively as an actor, appearing in many feature films, including THE BEST MAN, OH GOD!, DOCTOR DETROIT, YOUNG DOCTORS IN LOVE, THE MAN WITH TWO BRAINS, CANNONBALL RUN, HOOPER, BUTCH CASSIDY AND THE SUNDANCE KID, BLAZING SADDLES, SHAMPOO, SLEEPER, THE NEW INTERNS and MYRA BRECKINRIDGE; he has also acted in many major television shows. In addition to COMPANY, he has written the Broadway shows THE ACT, TWIGS, THE SUPPORTING CAST, MERRILY WE ROLL ALONG, PRECIOUS SONS and GETTING AWAY WITH MURDER.

#### **42ND STREET MOON**

42nd Street Moon was founded in 1993 by Greg MacKellan and Stephanie Rhoads and is nationally recognized for its dedication to preserving the history and vitality of musical theatre by producing of lesser-known musicals including early works by recognized composers, "one-hit wonders," and other worthy, if largely forgotten, titles. Productions began as staged readings, with minimal sets and costumes and with the actors holding their scripts during performances. They have evolved into the fully realized performances you see today, but the core components of those early productions remain - the intimacy of the space, the eschewing of microphones, and the focus on script and music over scenery and spectacle. The mission has evolved to include more recent works and several regional and world premieres, and to increase the physical scope of the productions to incorporate costumes, sets, and additional musicians while still focusing on story and song. 42ndstmoon.org

Daniel joined 42nd Street Moon in 2016, bringing over two decades of professional artistic and administrative leadership from across California, including 14 years as the the General Manager of Musical Theatre West. As an artist, Daniel has music directed and/or conducted Moon's productions of SATURDAY NIGHT, FIORELLO!, A GENTLEMAN'S GUIDE TO LOVE AND MURDER, A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC, and the concert productions of KISMET, FOLLIES, TITANIC, CHESS, and GYPSY; and performed onstage in ME AND MY GIRL (Gerald) and THE PAJAMA GAME (Prez). Over 17 years in Southern California, Daniel was an actor, musician, and music director for more than 100 productions at nearly every regional theatre in the Los Angeles area, including Musical Theatre West, McCoy-Rigby Productions, Moonlight Amphitheatre, 3-D Theatricals, Candelight Pavilion, the San Gabriel, Fullerton, and Santa Barbara Civic Light Operas, and Disneyland. Locally, Daniel has music directed for the Woodminster Amphitheatre in Oakland and Lyric Theatre in San Jose, and is the music director for Christ the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in San Jose. Daniel received his Bachelor of Music in Composition from UC Santa Barbara, and is beyond grateful to have the support of his wife Rebecca and son Joshua.

# FROM THE DIRECTOR

"Yesterday is done." Stephen Sondheim reminds us in the opening musical line of Merrily We Roll Along that we cannot go back and change the choices of our past that have led to today. Yet, that is exactly how the story, based on the Kaufman and Hart play of the same name is structured-- moving backwards through time, The show reveals piece by piece of youthful hope, growing optimism, and the reminder that our dreams will always be with us. When I first began working on Merrily We Roll Along, I, like so many who have worked on or grown to love this quirky show believe it to be a piece that highlights regret and the difficult choices people face as they grow up and aspire for success. However, after spending the last several weeks with this group of vibrant and passionate actors and theatre artists, I have guite a different perspective. Yes, Frank's story is a cautionary one, but it does not have to be our story. Throughout the show, Frank is again and again offered other choices that might have led to a different outcome-choices that might have allowed for both artistic and financial success, that might not have taken his relationships and friendships for granted, choices that might not have gotten in the way of his dream. The more time I spend with this show, the more it becomes clear that this story about growing up is full of hope and optimism. This is not simply a story about what happens when an artist sacrifices artistic integrity for money or losing friendships based on those and other choices (two clear themes that run deeper than they appear on the surface). This story is about being able to have both commercial and artistic success, about the friends that fight for us and alongside us as we grow up, and about not taking what we have for granted. "Dreams don't die," a line sung repeatedly on this journey, reminds us that our dreams stay with us, whether we let things get in the way of them or not. They stay with us - it reminds us to tend our dreams. -Dennis Lickteig
