#### **STEWART LYLE** Technical Director

Stewart has worked on 14 shows with 42nd Street Moon and performed on stage in a Moon fundraising gala and the BRIGA-DOON concert. Most recently Stewart was the scenic designer and technical director for THE SCOTTSBORO BOYS. Elsewhere, he's appeared in over 100 productions as an actor, directed more than 30 productions, designed over 70, and been Technical Director and head carpenter on more than 125. He received a Shellie Award nomination for best actor in SIDE BY SONDHEIM, a Bay Area Theatre Critics Circle Award nomination for scenic design of THREE TALL WOMEN, and a Theatre Bay Area Award nomination for direction of THE LIGHT IN THE PIAZZA. Love always to his wife Donna (also a 42nd Street Moon alumni) who he met (where else?) on stage.

#### JERRY BOCK Music

Jerry Bock (1928-2010) was born in New Haven, Connecticut. His first collaboration with Sheldon Harnick was 1956's THE BODY BEAUTIFUL in Philadelphia. Next, Jule Styne and Tommy Valano midwifed Bock, Larry Holofcener and George Weiss into birthing MR. WONDERFUL starring Sammy Davis Jr. The title song and "Too Close For Comfort" are still active off springs. Bock and Harnick's celebrated collaboration yielded five scores in seven years. THE BODY BEAUTIFUL, FIORELLO! (winner of Broadway's triple crown: The Tony Award, The New York Critics' Circle Award and The Pulitzer Prize in drama, the fourth musical to do so). TENDER-LOIN, SHE LOVES ME - (winner of Variety's poll of critics as best musical, citing Bock and Harnick as best composer and lyricist). FIDDLER ON THE ROOF - (nine Tonys, notably the citation for best musical of the year), THE APPLE TREE and THE ROTHSCHILDS. Bock and Harnick have been triply honored by being inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame, receiving the Johnny Mercer Award from the Songwriters Hall of Fame and dear is the honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree from the University of Wisconsin. It was there that he met his wife Patti, and it was there that he decided to be a composer. Mr. Bock is a member of a number of professional guilds and associations, among which the BMI Foundation, Inc. is a membership he relishes. As for Patti, his wife, George, their son and Portia, their daughter, Bock confesses they are his longest running hit.

#### **SHELDON HARNICK Lyrics**

Sheldon Harnick's (born 1924) career began in the 1950s with songs in revues (e.g., "The Boston Beguine," "The Merry Little Minuet"). With Jerry Bock he created a number of memorable musicals, including FIORELLO! (Tony Award, Pulitzer Prize), TENDERLOIN, SHE LOVES ME (Grammy), FIDDLER ON THE ROOF (Tony), THE APPLE TREE, and THE ROTHSCHILDS (subsequently revised as ROTHSCHILD & SONS). Other collaborations: REX (Richard Rodgers), A CHRISTMAS CAROL (Michel Legrand), A WONDERFUL LIFE (Joe Raposo), THE PHANTOM TOLLBOOTH (Arnold Black, Norton Juster), and THE AUDITION (Marvin Hamlisch). He has written three musicals himself: DRAGONS, A DOCTOR IN SPITE OF HIMSELF, and MALPRACTICE MAKES PERFECT. He and his wife Margery currently reside in New York City.

#### JOE MASTEROFF Book

Joe Masteroff (1919-2018) was best known as the book writer for the Tony Award-winning CABARET. Coming to New York from Philadelphia after attending Temple University and serving in the U.S. Air Force, he was represented in New York City by the play THE WARM PENINSULA, the libretto for an operatic version of Eugene O'Neill's DESIRE UNDER THE ELMS and the book and lyrics for a recent production of SIX WIVES at the York Theatre Company.

#### **42ND STREET MOON**

42nd Street Moon was founded in 1993 by Greg MacKellan and Stephanie Rhoads and is nationally recognized for its dedication to preserving the history and vitality of musical theatre by producing of lesser-known musicals including early works by recognized composers, "one-hit wonders," and other worthy, if largely forgotten, titles. Productions began as staged readings, with minimal sets and costumes and with the actors holding their scripts during performances. They have evolved into the fully realized performances you see today, but the core components of those early productions remain - the intimacy of the space, the eschewing of microphones, and the focus on script and music over scenery and spectacle. The mission has evolved to include more recent works and several regional and world premieres, and to increase the physical scope of the productions to incorporate costumes, sets, and additional musicians while still focusing on story and song. 42ndstmoon.org

# **80+ YEARS OF ROMANTIC COMEDY PERFECTION**

Boy meets girl. Boy hates girl. Boy gets pen pal. Boy loves pen pal. Girl meets boy. Girl hates boy. Girl gets pen pal. Girl loves pen pal. (no spoilers!)

Miklós László (1903-1973) grew up in Budapest, Hungary. Already a well-known playwright in his 30s (having won the Hungarian equivalent of the Pulitzer Prize), he and his family emigrated to America on the eve of World War II. Shortly before leaving Budapest, his best-known work, *Ilatszertár (Parfumerie* in English) made its debut and was a critical and popular success - following the foibles of middle-class shop clerks as they fall in and out of love.

Almost immediately upon arriving in America, *Parfumerie* was picked up for adaptation and became the 1940 film *The Shop Around the Corner*, starring James Stewart, Margaret Sullivan, and Frank Morgan, and directed by Ernst Lubitsch. The film was also a success and has become one of the best-loved and most highly-regarded romantic comedies, having been selected for the National Film Registry.

While *The Shop Around the Corner* hewed closely to *Parfumerie* in terms of setting and characters, the second film adaptation - 1949 MGM musical In *The Good Old Summertime* - was a looser re-telling, moving the setting to a music shop in Chicago. This film was a showcase for Judy Garland, and was also the film debut for her three-year-old daughter, Liza Minelli.

The third film adaptation came in 1998 with You've Got Mail, starring Tom Hanks and Meg Ryan. Again, the setting was changed, this time to New York, and the plot was modernized - rather than pen and paper, the protagonists communicate anonymously over e-mail. Once again, the charm of the story enchanted audiences, and the film was a major success.

Now, back up a few decades and we come to *She Loves Me*. The musical opened in 1963 and featured quite a pedigree - book by Joe Masteroff (who went on to do the book for *Cabaret*), music by Jerry Bock and lyrics by Sheldon Harnick (composers of the Pulitzer Prize-winning *Fiorello!* and who would pen the songs for *Fiddler on the Roof* the following year), direction by Harold Prince, choreography by Carol Haney, and a cast headed by Barbara Cook. *She Loves Me* was nominated for five Tonys, including Best Musical (losing to some now-forgotten show called *Hello, Dolly!*). Successful Broadway revivals of the show came in 1993 and 2016.

Although perhaps not terribly well-known by casual theatre-goers, *She Loves Me* seems to cast a spell over those who enounter it - it has been called "a jewel box of a show" and "romantic musical comedy perfection." Featuring Bock and Harnick's most lyrical score, it is the epitome of sweetness and charm.
